# UNTOLD STORIES OF GENEROSITY EMERGE

Interviewed for *The Stawell Times-News* last week, Pomonal Community Resilience Group volunteer John Matthews has swung the spotlight onto the generosity of a specific group of strangers in the days immediately following the Pomonal bushfires.

"This group of farmers heard about the fire's impact on Pomonal, and quickly realised that there may be a need for hay and fodder for livestock in the area," said Matthews, referring to quick-thinking and kind-natured souls from the Sea Lake and Berriwillock districts.

Through a series of conversations which quickly unfolded between Matthews, Col and Susie Macaffer, and farmers Mike McMurtrie and Jill Miller, a B-Double truck loaded with 58 large bales of oats, wheat, barley and vetch hay arrived in Pomonal in early March.

But the kindness of strangers didn't end there. A second truck - filled with 59 precious bales - soon arrived in Dadswell Bridge, after Pomonal volunteers realised they had more than they needed at that time.

Residents who had lost fences, pasture and feed to the fires were incredibly grateful for this unexpected gift, with Matthews leading the call of heartfelt thanks for the farmers' "strong sense of mateship" and willingness to help strangers who were, he attested, "just a mate they haven't met yet."


