RMIT UNI CONDUCTING POMONAL BUSHFIRE INTERVIEWS

RMIT University is conducting a study on the 2024 bushfire in Pomonal, and are looking for residents to each take part in a one-hour interview.

NEW POMONAL DONATIONS GROUP FORMED

The Pomonal Bushfire Recovery Donations Group has been established as a subcommittee of the Pomonal Progress Association (Resilience), with a mission to ensure that the donation money amassed for Pomonal's bushfire recovery is "managed and spent with transparency, fairness, and adherence to ethical and legal standards, involving the whole Pomonal Community," the Group wrote via Facebook on 5 July 2024.

The Pomonal Progress Association (PPA) hosted the first meeting of the Donations Group in late June 2024.

"Our primary goal is to create an inclusive process that gathers input from the whole community on the best ways to use the donation money," continues the Group's post. "We will seek expert opinion where necessary and work with the Pomonal Grants Writing Group to assist when needed to secure extra funds. The Group will make decisions by consensus, using a PPA decision-making framework. All the donation money is now centralised in a new account under the umbrella of PPA, [and] new donations will add to the account.

"We have invited two independent people to join us who have been part of fundraising and volunter work for Pomonal: Bob Saunders (Ararat) and Greg Little (Stawell), who are both experienced in recovery and are with us as community people. Bob has been elected as the chair.

"The other Donations Group members are all part of the community, belonging to (but not representing) many differen groups in Pomonal. They understand they are representing the whole community... Together we have access to many groups and networks in Pomonal."

Members of the Donations Group include Jill Miller (PPA leadership), Dee Anne Kelly and Glen Holland, Col Macaffer (GoFundMe), Jocelyn King & Alison Bainbridge (Resilience Voucher Distribution), Barb Venn (Pomonal Hall and Oval Complex) and Sue Macaffer (Resilience Group).
