#### POMONAL NATIVE FLOWER SHOW OPEN THIS WEEKEND

ABC's Gardening Australia television crew will capture all the action at Pomonal Native Flower Show this weekend, marking the event's 40th anniversary edition.

Edible natives are the 2024 Show's focus, with an array of market stalls, refreshments, expert advice and plant and book sales also planned.



Attendees will be treated to two keynote speeches (one on each day of the Show) from Bundjalung Nation (NSW north coast) educator, musician, dancer and *Gardening Australia* presenter Clarence Slockee (above).

The speaker timetable also includes conservationist and horticulturalist Neil Marriott speaking on WAMA and plants endemic to the Grampians area, and Julie Weatherhead of Peppermint Ridge Farm and the Australian Plant Society giving an explainer on methods of cooking Australian native foods.

Running concurrently with the Show, Pomonal Market will hold a two-day trade on the adjacent oval.

## 3-PHASE POWER COMING TO POMONAL HALL

Council have informed the Pomonal Community Assets Committe that the very first stages of arranging 3-Phase power for the Hall are underway. The Hall is currently run on 2-Phase, which is insufficient for certain events (such as Pomonal Market and Men's Shed activities).


The upgrade is still 4 - 6 months away, but Hall users can look forward to the new system's higher load capacity and stable, continuous power supply.

### **TUNNEL TRACK LOOP** WALK WORKS TO COMMENCE THIS MONTH




Construction work for the Tunnel Track Loop Walk is due to begin this month, in the week beginning September 23. The project - part of Planning Permit PA3093 - aims to enhance the community's recreational offerings with a new and improved walking track.

The initial phase of the project will involve track-clearing works. To ensure the safety and clarity of the project, alignment and protection flagging will be marked out over the next few weeks. This will help to delineate the track's route and safeguard any environmentally sensitive areas during construction.

"We understand that construction activities can be disruptive, and we appreciate your patience and cooperation as we work to bring this exciting new asset to our community," Council CEO Dr Tim Harrison said in a letter to residents.

#### **EMERGENCY SPORTING EQUIPMENT GRANT OPEN**

Sport and Recreation Victoria has announced its Emergency Sporting Equipment pool of funding, which grants eligible clubs up to \$1,000 each. It's designed to help grassroots organisations replace or repair essential sport or first aid equipment that has been lost or destroyed because of unpreventable incidents, including bushfire and flood.

Affected organisations are encourage to apply at https:// sport.vic.gov.au/funding/emergency-sporting-equipmentgrant-program.

Applications close on 31 May 2025, or when the funding is exhausted.

### **CFA SHARE FIRE DANGER** PERIOD PREP INFO

Pomonal CFA are urging residents to check the rules and recommendations around vegetation removal in preparation for the upcoming Fire Danger Period.

While some kinds of vegetation removal require a planning permit, there are exemptions which allow clearing hazards to create a defendable space for bushfire protection without a permit.

A 'defendable space' is an area of land around a building where vegetation is modified to reduce the amount of fuel available to burn during a bushfire, and separates the fuel from the building.

Before you clear vegetation you should check if the rules apply to your property.

Head to planning.vic.gov.au and search for 'Vegetation removal for bushfire protection' to read about the '10/30' and '10/50' rules, the rules for clearing along fencelines, how to manage the risk of erosion when clearing vegetation, and more.
