# **ROADSIDE BUSHFIRE DEBRIS CLEAN-UP COMMENCES**

Monday marked the beginning of a roadside bushfire debris clean-up program lead by the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action (DEECA) - Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic), and supported by the Department of Transport and Planning (DOTP).

Over the next few weeks, these organisations will be working to clear debris along Ararat-Halls Gap Road and Pomonal Road. They will also be operating on local roads, in particular Waterhole Road, Springwood Hill Road, Cherrytree Road, Church Road, Millers Creek Road, and Tunnel Road. Other roads may also be identified as works progress.

The aim is to clear as much bushfire debris (i.e. burnt and fallen trees/limbs/branches) as possible within the scope of work and funding.

Removed trees and timber will be assessed as either suitable for firewood or suitable for chipping into wood mulch.

The firewood will be stockpiled at the back of Pomonal Recreation Reserve for Pomonal residents to collect. The wood mulch will also be stockpiled on the reserve, but will be made available to anyone; mulch is more suited to properties less prone to bushfire and ember attack than those in and around Pomonal.

Be aware that some mulches can be a significant fire hazard if used and managed incorrectly. Please refer to the CSIRO's website on the use of mulches. If you know of anyone outside of the Pomonal area who could make use of the wood mulch (e.g. in Stawell, Ararat, or outside a bushfire prone area), please let them know of this resource.

Any excess material not collected will be disposed of.

Pomonal residents are asked to please be respectful and share the firewood around as much as possible. If you are unable to collect your own firewood, ask a neighbour or friend who may be able to help; the Hub may also be able to connect you with someone who can assist.


## LOCAL-LED MUSIC FEST **LANDS NEXT WEEK**




### THIS WEEKEND: POMONAL **ART SHOW & FESTIVAL**

#### POMONAL TRANSFER STATION

Pomonal Transfer Station has resumed normal operating hours, and fees and charges are still being waived for Pomonal residents until further notice.

Cleanaway Stawell is no longer taking waste free of charge, and any waste arriving at the site must be via a commercial operator or truck.
