FIREWOOD COLLECTION AREAS NOW OPEN

Firewood collection areas are now open. Spring is the ideal time to visit State forests and collect free firewood. Depending on the type of vegetation and level of dryness when cut, most wood takes longer than twelve months to dry. If you rely on wood for heating and cooking, now is the time to start planning for the winter 2026 season and beyond.
